



## Roger J. Cadieux, M.D., Class of 1963

Roger Cadieux is remembered fondly by his classmates, but it is as a physician that he has truly made his mark on this world.

Dr. Cadieux began his training at the Lawrence and Memorial Hospital School of Anesthesia in New London, CT. He joined the U.S. Air Force, rising to the rank of Captain and went on to receive his B. S. from Northwestern State University in Natchitoches Louisiana and his M.D. from Louisiana State University in Shreveport. He did his residency

and became a Psychogeriatric Fellow, at the Pennsylvania State University College of Medicine in Hershey, PA.

Dr. Cadieux has had a long and impressive career in medicine. Beginning as an Assistant Professor, he spent more than 30 years at the Department of Psychiatry of the Milton S. Hershey Medical Center, the last 14 years of which was a Clinical Professor. At the same time, he was Program Director of the Pennsylvania Department of Aging, helping to develop statewide diagnostic and evaluation centers for Alzheimer's.

He belongs to numerous professional societies, received an impressive array of awards and honors, and has been included in "Who's Who in America" since 1981, and "Who's Who in American Medicine" since 1994. He was elected to Fellowship status by the American Psychiatric Association in 1995, became a Distinguished Fellow in 2003, and was designated a Distinguished Life Fellow in 2011. He has published dozens of articles in prestigious medical journals and is frequently called upon to provide Continuing Medical Education presentations.

Since 2013, Dr. Cadieux has acted as a Consultant for the Magellan Health Corporation, assisting with exposing fraud and abuse. He currently volunteers at the Freestore Foodbank, the Honor Flight Network, and the Friends of the Sesame Rescue & Adoption organization.
