

William C. Keppler, III, M.D.



Dr. Keppler is the chief of forensic psychiatry at Madison Army Medical Center (MAMA). He is a psychiatric consultant for MAMA, the Western Regional Medical Command, United States Coast Guard, and the Department of Defense Language School.

As a graduate of the United States Coast Guard Academy (1985), Doctor Keppler sailed for the Antarctic as part of Operation Deep Freeze and later served as a aide for Rear Admiral A.B. Beran, 111th Coast Guard District Commander.

Dr. Keppler had his M.D. conferred in 1997 by the Uniformed Services University of the Health Sciences and its affiliated medical teaching hospitals - Walter Reed Army Medical Center and the National Naval Medical Center.

As chief of the Department of Behavioral Health at Irwin Army Community Hospital, he served as clinical medical director and forensic psychiatry expert to Fort Riley and Fort Leavenworth providing clinical services, court-ordered forensic evaluations, and expert court testimony.
